



**Starter:** Open-faced mini sandwiches, a classic Czech appetizer often served at New Year's celebrations and family gatherings.

**Did you know?:** These sandwiches are a festive favorite at Czech New Year celebrations and family events.

**Main Dish:** Španělské ptáčky (Spanish Birds):

Thin beef rolls stuffed with bacon, sausage, pickles, and onion, then simmered in a rich brown gravy. They are typically served with rice.

**Fun Fact:** Despite the name, this dish is not actually Spanish. It originated in 19th-century Czech kitchens, and although one theory links it to Spanish chefs at the court of Rudolf II, the modern version is distinctly Czech.

**Dessert:** Traditional Czech blueberry cake with a crumb topping.

**Get this!:** The Czech word for crumb topping is “drobenka.” Related terms include “drobky” (crumbs), “posypka” (sprinkle topping), and “zmolenka.”

**Beverages:** Traditional Czech beer, along with nonalcoholic drinks and other beverage options.
